Finance

Wow, June already?

Not too much to report from the finance committee currently. Attendance during the April committee was kind of lonely (committee of one).

Eloy has returned from the conference and brought some news that will effect our budget going forward.

a Motion from the Finance Committee came to the Floor to raise the Suggested contribution from \$1,800 to \$2,200 and passed so \$2,200 is the new Suggested Contribution.

I will make the adjustments to the 2024 budget and make sure to show the changes for the next rotation and the budgets going forward.

Another item of interest to the area will be the Archives. Currently we are paying \$900/year for the archives to be stored at the Albuquerque central office. Our lease is ending at the end of 2023 however there is the offer to allow the archives to expand into a larger space as the central office expands. This option would cost an additional \$900/year bringing our annual rent up to \$1,800. So far as the area Archives chair researches options this is by far the cheapest option with the next cheapest coming in around \$3,000 per year.

Another note of interest is that with our Alt-Delegate's help I have reached out to other Finance chairs and Treasurers throughout our region and created a ad-hoc group so that we can learn from each other and to provide support for current and upcoming rotations ultimately benefiting from each others experience, strength and hopes for each area within the region.

Finally I promised to remind my fellow committee chairs of the 12 step service budget that has been set up for use. please reach out to me, the chair and the area treasurer if you would like to request some of these funds for your service work.
