Hello, Area 46 Trusted Servants. I hope you are enjoying these HOT summer days.

As we approach elections at all levels within Area 46, I have been studying Concept IX. In this concept Bill is talking about leadership in A.A. Most of us think about his essay on leadership but I have been studying what comes before that essay. He talks about choosing the "best qualified people we can name." As your group prepares to elect it's G.S.R. and other servants; as your district prepares to elect a new D.C.M. and other servants and as our area prepares to elect our Panel 74 Delegate, Alternate Delegate and Area officers, please contemplate who are the most qualified people we can name for each of these critical roles within our service structure.

Excerpt from Concept IX

"With leadership we shall have a continuous problem. Good leadership can be here today and gone tomorrow. Furnishing our service structure with able and willing workers has to be a continuous activity. It is therefore a problem that in its very nature cannot be permanently solved. We must continuously find the right people for our many service tasks. Since our future effectiveness must thus depend upon ever-new generations of leaders, it seems desirable that we now proceed to define what a good service leader should be; that we carefully indicate in each level of service, especially in our Board of Trustees, what special skills will always be required; and that we review our present methods of finding and choosing that leadership.

First let's remember that the base for our service structure rests on the dedication and ability of several thousand General Service Representatives (G.S.R.'s), several hundred area Committee Members, and nearly a hundred Delegates. These are the direct agents of the A.A. groups; these are the indispensable linkage between our Fellowship and its world service; these are the primary representatives of A.A.'s group conscience. Without their support and activity we could not operate permanently at all.

When making their choices of G.S.R.'s, the A.A. groups should therefore have such facts well in mind. It ought to be remembered that it is only the G.S.R.'s who, in Group Assembly meetings (or in caucus) can name Committee Members and finally name the Delegates. Hence great care needs to be taken by the groups as they choose these Representatives. Hit-or-miss methods should be avoided. Groups who name no G.S.R.'s should be encouraged to do so. In this area a degree of weakness tends to persist. The needed improvement seems to be a matter of increased care, responsibility and education.

As the G.S.R.'s meet in their Assemblies to name Delegates, an even greater degree of care and dedication will be required. Personal ambitions will have to be cast aside, feuds and controversy forgotten. "Who are the best qualified people that we can name?" This should be the thought of all "

Clarify when something is unclear and laugh at yourself. Don't be afraid to pause now and again to take it all in. After all, you have grown up here. You will fall in love with service all over again just as you did when you were a freshly elected GSR.

You will meet people you now call family. You will begin to see others grow and become leaders. Remember you are never done growing.

Funding:

- Created a spreadsheet documenting those who are currently contributing financially to El Farolito

- Of the 290 groups in the print database only 41 groups are currently contributing to the production and distribution of the newsletter. Donation totals were 97 contributions for 5 months
- The result is that for the last 3 months the contributions have dwindled to an average of \$255 a month of the \$570 average needed. Elf cannot sustain print production at this rate.
- There is a prudent reserve. I am working with the ELF committee and Officers to see how we continue to reduce expenses and increase donations..
- Information is available if you want to know if your group is contributing to ELF.

Conclusion:

I thank all those who have supported and assisted me by providing direction and in helping me to produce a quality El Farolito Newsletter. Finally, I want to remind contributors that one way to manage expenses is to make sure that articles are limited to 300 words or less. It is my hope that through the awareness of the current financial situation that Groups will step up to supporting this vital means of Area 46 communication. I hope everyone is enjoying your summer:) Here's a couple of updates from your Literature Committee:

For the August Assembly I have once again asked our Delegate Eloy to lead our Committee meeting with a report from the recent General Service Conference, and once again he has graciously accepted! Eloy has spent his rotation as our representative from Area 46 serving on the Literature Committee at the GSC, and as such has been front and center for much of the sometimes difficult discussions and decisions regarding our AA Literature and therefore our ability as a whole to ensure that we are effectively carrying the message to the still suffering alcoholic. Because recovery in AA is a deeply personal and unique experience for each one of us, we of course have very strong feelings about how to move forward and keep growing in both our personal and collective processes.

Literature

Therefore, I feel that rather than me trying to translate Eloy's experience in service on behalf of our Area, it would be best if he has the opportunity to address those who are passionate about our Literature directly. I attended our first State Convention in 4 years (!) in Carlsbad in June and attended Eloy's first post-Conference report and was moved, grateful, and proud to be a member of Alcoholics Anonymous as well as humbled by the challenges we continue to confront and work through as a fellowship. Please join us!

During my rotation as your Literature Committee Chair, I have also had many changing ideas about what this position entails, and after spending time with some of our District Literature Chairs helping to define what their role is, it has helped bring some clarity to me about how our Area Committee can be more effective. Based on the guidelines we drafted to help the District Chairs, we will be submitting a motion to update and help clarify some of the job duties for the Literature Committee Chairperson in our A.I.P. The focus will be more about supporting and coordinating with the District Chairs to assist with matters such as ordering and inventory, and with items of importance such as the Conference Agenda Items, the role of the Literature Committee, and how to participate in General Service in AA. The other goal is to streamline our Area Literature inventory with a focus on all service-related materials such as our Service Manual and AIP, the various committee workbooks, guidelines and other service-related pamphlets and materials, a limited quantity of standard AA materials such as the Big Book, Twelve and Twelve, and Daily Reflections, and showcasing new additions to our AA Literature. Additionally, we now have a PayPal account that needs to be referenced, as well as maintaining an account with aa.org/literature on behalf of Area 46.

Considering the importance of our Literature, the work of the GSC Committee and the role of Publishing to AA, it seems unfair that in order for someone to pursue this important commitment in our Area they need to own a truck, have half a garage or storage locker for the inventory and displays, and literally the physical strength to move it all around. I would like to see the materials be able to fit in the trunk of a car and the actual work be more reflective of the job duties outlined in Concept 11 "The Literature Committee" (on page C39 of the current Service Manual). I hope we will have your support!

I have begun to share the Suggested Guidelines that we drafted for District Literature Chairs, and I will be sending them out to all of the DCM's following the Assembly as everyone starts to prepare for the next rotation. 




