Plain Language Big Book

The new book Plain Language Big Book: A Tool for Reading Alcoholics Anonymous is now available for sale for \$11.

Initial Sales - The first print run for the

book was 70,000 copies and is nearly sold out. Publishing is in the process of deciding how many to order for the second print run. The second print run will be between 50k to 100.

Error in First Printing - The advisory action that was passed regarding the Plain Language Big Book: A Tool for Reading Alcoholics Anonymous, included two edits. One of those edits was to remove all references to "addiction" and "addicted" in the book. Unfortunately, it was discovered on the day of release that these references were not removed from the final version. The Trustees Committee on Literature has apologized for the oversight and has corrected it for the second print run which will be made shortly.

Libro Big Book en Lenguaje Sencillo

At the upcoming assembly in Taos, Area 46 will entertain bids from Districts to host the December 2025 Assembly. Bids for 2026 assemblies to be held in March, August, and December are also welcome. We know that hosting an assembly can seem daunting and there are many hurdles to overcome, particularly finding a venue and funding. However, we have seen many hosting districts have success, growth, and unity through participation when they take on this commitment.

The Area is currently exploring ways to make hosting an assembly perhaps more manageable and affordable. It is likely our 2025 budget will increase the assembly hosting funds from \$1200 to \$2000. Our October Assembly Planning Workshop centered around brainstorming solutions and minutes are available by request. This will obviously be an ongoing conversation, and we welcome any feedback that may help set us in the right direction. We are also open to comments that may reveal other reasons why Districts may find bidding for assemblies difficult or unattractive.

If your District is interested in hosting an assembly or would like more information, please contact Christoph or me. We want to hear from you and your groups, and we are here to help and support along the way.

I am continuing to liaise with all Central Offices/Intergroups and AA entities performing similar functions within Area 46. I appreciate the opportunity to participate and learn more through these connections.

I hope everyone had a great time at the area assembly in Taos.

I know I'm looking forward to it.

October was a quiet month when it comes to the finances, yet life can't be that simple and I find myself with a financial knot that has me unable to produce reports from the books to my satisfaction.

All the numbers match but how I allocated funds in months past are not matching how I would allocate them today. I am working with past treasurers and others to figure out the correct way to fix the issues I created for myself. To provide a little more detail on what I'm talking about. We allocated some funds for the Archives committee chair to attend the national conference.


District 18
