A.A. Around the World






District Boundaries

December 2020




Albuquerque Metro (5 Districts)




A.A. Service Structure


Concept 1

The final responsibility and the ultimate authority for A.A. World Services should always reside in the collective conscience of our whole fellowship.

- 1) The Group is the ultimate Authority of AA
- 2) GSR works for the Group
- 3) GSR carries the Group's Conscience to the District Committee, not his own opinion or vote.

The spirit of Anonymity is also applicable as a "Spiritual Foundation" of Concept One.








Your Home Group

- While many A.A. members attend other groups as well, the home group is where they participate in business meetings and cast their vote as part of the group conscience of the Fellowship as a whole.
- As with all group conscience matters, each member has one vote.

Your Role as GSR

Your Role as GSR

GSRs express their group's conscience in 3 ways...

- 1. When the GSR is present at district meetings and assemblies, the group's voice is heard.
- 2. When the GSR participates, the group's voice is heard.
- 3. When the GSR votes, the group's voice is heard.

Area 46 Assemblies

March Assembly

The Area 46 pre-conference assembly is held the last weekend in March every year. In addition to conducting area business, this assembly is for our delegate to better understand how our area as a whole feels about items that will be discussed by the General Service Conference.

August Assembly

Typically held on the first weekend in August. In <u>odd years</u>, this is our <u>election</u> <u>assembly</u>. Here we elect our Area 46 officers for the next two-year rotation. Also, the budget for the upcoming year is presented by the Finance Committee and regular assembly business is conducted.

December Assembly

Typically held on the first weekend of December, the <u>budget</u> for the following year will be voted on and regular assembly business is conducted. In odd years, this is the final assembly for the current rotation.

Area Assembly Purpose

An area's purpose is threefold:

- 1. To elect a delegate who will represent the area's conscience at the annual General Service Conference, where decisions are made that affect A.A. throughout the U.S. & Canada.
- 2. To form a local decision-making structure so groups can collectively decide on matters that affect their area.
- 3. To carry out Twelfth Step work that may not be practical for groups, districts or intergroups to take on by themselves. Examples include, but are not limited to:
 - Accessibility
 - Area bulletin or newsletter
 - Cooperation with the Professional Community (CPC)
 - Corrections

Area Special Committees

Ad Hoc Committees - Ad Hoc Committees serve as advisory committees to the Area Assembly and may be formed to deal with special situations that may arise from time to time. Ad Hoc Committees may be formed at any time by the Area Chairperson.



GSR Role at Area Assemblies

- As your home group's GSR, you are their elected voice who speaks on behalf of the group and votes likewise.
- You can make motions and second motions.
- You can participate in the discussion of motions and contribute to sharing sessions and committee meetings.
- You can speak for the minority opinion during voting.
 - Important if your group's opinion is in the minority.
- You are the communication conduit between your Group, the District, the Area and the Delegate.

What Happens in Old Business

What Happens in New Business

- New committee chair(s) are presented for disapproval.
 (In December of odd years)
- Motions and items for discussion are presented and discussed.
 - This is the only time that we discuss the items.
 - Voted upon on Sunday morning
 - Only Minority Opinion is heard on Sunday
 - Full discussion is critical



*How to Make a Motion

- 1. Any voting member can make a motion. If you need assistance preparing a motion see any Area trusted servant, past delegate, or DCM.
- 2. Motions should be emailed or texted to the Secretary when the motion is made, ideally <u>before</u> Assembly.

(Include your name and voting position with the motion)

3. If your motion requires Area funding, include as part of the motion the costs and where the funding will come from.

(see Finance chair or Treasurer for help)

The Six Warranties of Concept XII

At the heart of each area is the assembly meeting, where the democratic voice of our Fellowship expresses itself. While each area has the autonomy to conduct its meetings according to its conscience, Concept XII offers the General Warranties of the Conference as the guiding principles to remain democratic in thought and action.

Warranty One: "The Conference shall never become the seat of perilous wealth or power."

Warranty Two: "Sufficient operating funds, plus an ample Reserve, should be its prudent financial principle."

Warranty Three: "None of the Conference members shall ever be placed in a position of unqualified authority over any of the others."

Warranty Four: "That all important decisions be reached by discussion, vote, and, whenever possible, by substantial unanimity."

Warranty Five: "That no Conference action ever be personally punitive or an incitement to public controversy."

Warranty Six: "That though the Conference may act for the service of Alcoholics Anonymous, it shall never perform any acts of government; and that, like the Society of Alcoholics Anonymous which it serves, the Conference itself will always remain democratic in action and in spirit."





General Service Representative (G.S.R.) Service Information

What is a G.S.R?

Your group's link to A.A. as a whole

The general service representatives (G.S.R.s) of the U.S. and Canada are the very foundation of our general service structure. Through your G.S.R., you can make your group's voice heard at district meetings, at area assemblies, and eventually at the General Service Conference.

When you're a general service representative (G.S.R.)

You are linking your home group with the whole of A.A. In 1950, a new type of trusted servant, "group representative," was suggested to help in the selection of delegates to the newly formed General Service Conference. By 1953, the job of group representative was also seen as a good means of exchanging up-to-date information between individual groups and "Headquarters" (now the General Service Office). That's still an important side of your work. But now, as general service representative, you have an even bigger responsibility: You transmit ideas and opinions, as well as facts; through you, the group conscience becomes a part of "the collective conscience of our whole Fellowship," as expressed in the General Service Conference. Like everything else in A.A., it works through a series of simple steps. (For the complete picture in detail, read The A.A. Service Manual.)




