

# Technology

Hello Area 46!

The Technology Committee is continuing to look into improving the experience of both in-person and virtual attendees at our hybrid assemblies. We are also working with the Area Chair to update technical requirements for assembly host venues so we can hopefully have more consistent experiences across the state.

# Technology

I attended part of the National AA Technology Workshop virtually last month and am preparing a presentation about AA websites to be given at SWRAASA in Tulsa, OK this month.

The Technology Committee plans to bring a motion to the December assembly asking that we approve requests to share elements of our website with other AA Area's who wish to build a similar site of their own.

We have formed a subcommittee to evaluate how providing technical support for hybrid area events has impacted the position of the Area 46 Technology Chair; and to make recommendations for how the Technology Committee might be organized to ensure that all responsibilities are met without making unreasonable demands upon the time of the Technology Chair and committee members.

If a substantial change to the Technology Chair's responsibilities (and thus the AIP) is to be made, it is hoped that a proposal can be presented at the March 2023 Area Assembly and a motion to be voted on made at the August 2023 Area Assembly. This will provide members time to consider the changes prior to voting and will give the Finance Committee the opportunity to adjust the budget prior to the year-end, if needed.

The subcommittee may explore and recommend any possible solution that is within the scope of its purpose, including but not limited to:

Making a Website Chair a subcommittee role of the Technology Committee

Making Hybrid Assembly Production a subcommittee role of the Technology Committee

Creating an Alternate Technology Chair role

Separating the Web & Technology

The ninth Southwest-Area Conference of Young People in AA (SWACYPAA) will be hosted in Albuquerque in 2023.
