# <u>Tr</u>easurer

Sigh,

This is a lifelong task. So I made a mistake last month. I sent the text with all the right numbers but I sent the visual report with the prior months data. (Facepalm).

For that I apologize and will work to make sure I pay attention and verify before hitting submit.

That being said. Here are the numbers for September 2024.

September was a quiet month, we received \$1,392 in group and member contributions (Check below to make sure your group was recognized!). Our insurance came due for coverage at the assemblies and area events like the planning meeting in Oct. That amount is the \$1,269 you see under assemblies in the following report.

The \$1,400 is the money we set aside to help the interpreters travel to SWRAASA (We have another \$1,400 more to help support the speakers who will be attending, you should see that in the Nov and Dec reports). The \$7.59 is a blend of \$5 for the phone that allows us to take Venmo contributions and 2.59 in Paypal fees.

Under the Non-Budgeted income (\$20) I had an auto deposit happen where the money was earmarked for the 2025 SWRF. I have since fixed that issue and moved the money in the books and in the bank to the new 2025 SWRF account so that the two funds are no longer blended.

The other number in that report that may have you wondering what it is "ALLOCATED FUNDS" that consists of two years of convention seed money (\$14K), the overage from the 2024 convention (\$2.9K), an insurance fund to replace the translation equipment if something happens to it (\$3.5K) and finally the special project money (\$500 for Non profit research and \$870 from the International Women's conference).

Keeping the report short and sweet this month. Looking forward to seeing you this upcoming weekend at the Dec planning meeting!

Please reach out with any questions, concerns or criticisms you may have. Let's open the discussion.

I'm looking forward to the trip to Toas in Dec. It's been a year or thirty since I've been around real snow!! Las Cruces does not get much and if we get any it's usually gone by 10 am unless there's a shadow to protect it.



I asked if there were any thing readable, to please let me know. It was very exciting to think we might contribute something to GSO, especially a talk by Bill W.! 
#### District 18


Greetings from District 18
