

Special Needs

Some AA Districts are attempting to meet special needs by forming Special Needs Committees. Since the goal is to make AA accessible, research shows that some committees refer to themselves as Special Needs or Accessibilities Committees. When one or more members of a group have special needs, AA members from that group will attempt to see that those needs are met. The members of a Special Needs Committee explore, develop and offer resources to make the AA message and participation in our program available to everyone who reaches out for it. Special Needs Committees at the group level are encouraged to keep their District and local Central/Intergroup offices informed of their activities. It is also helpful to work closely with committees handling Public Information and Cooperation with the Professional Community in terms of keeping the public and appropriate agencies informed about AA being accessible to alcoholics with special needs.

We encourage Groups and Districts to complete the "Special Needs Survey" in efforts to assess how well special needs is being addressed. You can download a copy (both Group and District) surveys and/or complete the survey online from the New Mexico AA Area 46 website's Special Needs page. We suggest that you share your findings with the Area Special Needs Committee.

At the March Area Assembly, there was discussion regarding "Shut-ins", which are mobile groups that volunteer to take a regular A.A. meeting to those members who will be home bound or hospitalized for a long period of time. These members of our fellowship may consist of our old-timers, and we should not let them disappear because they can no longer attend meetings. It may be a member who has a chronic illness or is bed ridden due to an accident. Whatever the reason may be, they can no longer attend A.A. meetings for fellowship they need. It would be ideal if we had Mobile Groups in each district. It could prove to be such rewarding 12 Step work.

Please know that myself and committee members are available to speak at your District or provide a workshop to inform members of special needs efforts in your respective community. Feel free to contact me with any questions.

Treatment.

Since its beginning in 1935, the Fellowship of Alcoholics Anonymous has cooperated with treatment facilities. Bill W. himself was a product of a treatment facility—Towns Hospital in New York City. After he had finally put together several months of sobriety, Bill returned to Towns to try to work with other alcoholics. This was the beginning of A.A.'s Twelfth Step work in hospitals.

Ad Hoc Assembly Development and FUN Raising

Since the March Assembly, our committee has been studying the 86 evaluations which you all submitted about our first Pre-Conference. Thanks again to all of you who responded and for your positive feedback. In last month's *El Farolito*, I reported the committee's tabulation of your answers to the objective questions; this month I am sharing our analysis of your narrative comments.

The comments were primarily about the following concerns:

- 1. The Conference agenda topics and the background material need to be distributed earlier so they can be discussed by GSRs with their groups and studied by the area committee chairs in preparation for the assembly.
- 2. There needs to be more information about the Pre-Conference <u>process</u>. These things were suggested: have written information available at the Assembly; ask our Delegate to amplify his remarks on Pre-conference at the beginning of the Assembly; insure that those leading discussion of agenda topics are fully prepared.
- 3. Some committees had too many agenda topics and the issues were not clear.
- 4. Change the dates of the March Assembly to later in the month to give more time for study of the agenda topics.
- 5. Some responders felt there was too much repetition of the same agenda topics in the committee meetings, at the Sharing Session, and in the Sunday committee reports. Others thought the repetition was necessary to fully understand the issues.

We will be working with our Delegate and the Area Committee chairs on ways to address these issues over the next few months so that the Pre-conference in 2017 will be even better!




