By rotating out of a service position and truly letting go of the job, we open ourselves to an ongoing spiritual awakening."

These points are practical illustrations of the kinds of careful discrimination and soul-searching that true leadership must always try to exercise. I appreciate this expression of my own feelings regarding the benefits of allowing a Higher Power to lead the way.

## **Trusted Servant Reports**

#### Treasurer

28 groups contributed to Area 46 in June. Group contributions year-to-date are 21.6% lower in 2015 compared to 2014. You might recall there was a 39% difference at the end of the first quarter, so the situation has improved since that time; but we are still not quite out of the woods. Kurt and I will have more information available regarding our projections for the Area's ability to meet its budget obligations this year at the Assembly in September.

Expenses in June included the purchase of a projector which will be used for Area workshops, Assemblies and Conventions. Thank you to Brett B., Website Chair, for doing the research and purchasing the projector and necessary accessories. Expenses this month also included transportation expenses for our Area Archivist, Olivia O., to attend the National AA Archivist Workshop in September. Both of these projects were approved by the March Assembly.

The saga of securing general liability insurance for Area 46 has finally ended. After a thorough search, I ended up purchasing a policy from the same company that has been providing our general liability policy for at least the past 8 years. The issuing company was able to put me in contact with a local agency which could sell us a policy. Our coverage is exactly the same as before and the price was the same as well.

As AA groups grow in number in a community, experience suggests that a committee works more effectively.

Alan S. passed on this article that Loraine S, Panel 24 delegate wrote for El Farolito. This is being reprinted in tribute as she passed away in June with over 50 years of sobriety. She was also one of the three past delegates instrumental in creating the Albuquerque Central Office.

With infinite care, our founders created a world service structure which will insure unity and continuity for as long as we are willing to work to preserve it.

One of our co-founders, Bill, often used the words, "The future belongs to you." These words were specifically spoken at the General Service Conference in 1962. At that time the Conference gave its final approval to the Twelve Concepts for World Service. Bill also said, on that occasion, "since all my main service tasks are now complete, it seems right that my primary and long-held responsibility for our world operations out to end with this session. This should be the final step in placing AA wholly on its own.

In 1946 an earlier action had given us the Twelve Traditions which tell us how AA groups and individual members can relate to each other and to AA as a whole. The Twelve Concepts, then, provide us with a beautifully simple pattern for the functioning of our service structure and for the relationship of all its parts to the whole. They show us precisely how each part - our groups, the General Service Conference, our Board of Trustees, and our service organizations and committees - relate effectively to the others.

Is it not our responsibility to become comfortable enough with these Concepts to be able to picture the whole pattern, and understand the lines of communication so clearly set forth? Only through our own knowledge and understanding of the principles contained in the Concepts will we be able to communicate their importance to others. It should not be necessary to memorize the Concepts, but we surely ought to understand each one well enough to discuss it, its application and its importance to the future of Alcoholics Anonymous.

As Bill explains in his introduction to the Concepts, "They detail the experience and reasoning on which our operation stands today. The Concepts aim to record the why of our service structure in such a fashion that the highly valuable experience of the past and the lessons we have drawn from that experience can never be lost or forgotten."



#### WHERE DID THE FOUR ABSOLUTES COME FROM?

## The Principles of Jesus by Robert E. Speer

Fleming H Revell Company, 1902.

In this book Speer expands on the teachings of Jesus on many subjects with direct Bible referencing from the many books of the New Testament. Most notably is his chapter on Jesus and Standards. Here Speer outlines what he refers to as the Four Standards - truth, unselfishness, purity and love. Speer also contends that these standards were absolute, meaning there was no quibbling intended of their interpretation, they were, more or less, requirements. These Four Standards would later be expanded upon by Henry B. Wright into the Fourfold Touchstone. Frank Buchman was a student of Wright's and was greatly influenced in Wright in his early education. Wright also laid a foundation for the Oxford Group's practice of surrender, guidance, restitution and witness.

Buchman used the *Four Absolutes* as principles of the First Century Christian Fellowship, later named the Oxford Group. Buchman believed that "when a person listens to God and is in submission to the absolutes, God speaks. And when that person obeys the guidance he has been given, God acts."

The Oxford Group where Bill W. first found sobriety prior to meeting Dr. Bob in 1935 and the eventual founding of AA. Both Dr. Bob and Bill, as well as many early AA members attended Oxford Group meetings in the early day. Although ties were eventually broken with the Oxford Group for one of many reasons, some of the principles including the Four Absolutes continued to be taught as viable tools for long term sobriety and a serene life. In his last major talk in 1948, Dr. Bob still praised the practice of the Four Absolutes.

Speer was also a teacher of Samuel Shoemaker's at Princeton. In <u>How to Become a Christian</u> Shoemaker writes: One of the simplest and best rules for self-examination that I know is to use the Four Standards which Dr. Robert E. Speer said represented the summary of the Sermon on the Mount - Absolute Honesty, Absolute Purity, Absolute Unselfishness, and Absolute Love.
