As Chair of the Conference Committee on Treatment and Accessibilities, I

held our Treatment and Accessibilities Committee Meeting on 10/17. I also have meetings with the Class A, non-alcoholic Trustee on Treatment and CPC Peter Luongo before and after each Board Meeting. Ad Hoc Committee About the Books

Well first let me invite you to come to our Assembly Committee meeting at 10:55 a.m. on Saturday, December 5. In that meeting we will be asking the districts to imagine how they might respond to what is a proportional distribution of the 6,000 pieces of literature we received in March 2019 from MDC. Proportional, meaning the larger your district, the more books you would receive. We will have the proposed numbers available and we really would like to have a sense of how you might be able to use those books to benefit alcoholics who are not yet in our fellowship.

One of the principles we have seen surface in our work as a committee is "These books came from the world and need to go back to the world. They are not just for our current membership: we didn't buy them – they

are something we can and must give away." This means we really would invite all our Area to imagine who might best use free literature: libraries, schools, police departments, jails, prisons, treatment centers, homeless shelters, hospitals, etc.

Our question this assembly is, "Would your district like to receive any or all the books which could come to you if the Area accepts a proportional distribution?" Followed by, "Can you help us think through how to distribute these books out to the world?"

We do not yet have a firm recommendation to offer the Area. Your conscience on these questions will help us so much as we continue our work.

In the virtual Zoom world I'm moving right along learning but in-person meetings it looks like I was finally going to have the opportunity to visit groups and motivate members to join our committee, but as it looks restrictions are back and there goes the in-person meetings idea, good thing for Zoom meetings.

In the past month, I along with Stephen V. from Bridge the Gap Committee, visited Jovene's New Mexico A.A. recovery group/treatment home. 
