We must discourage our members and our friends in these fields from stressing the AA name in their publicity or appeals for funds. To act otherwise will certainly imperil our unity, and to maintain our unity is surely our greatest obligation – to our brother alcoholics and the public at large. Experience, we think, has already made these principles self-evident.

Literature...

We also suggest contacting GSO in NY, and requesting a starter packet, then we'd like to discuss functions a literature committee can do for a group or district.

Barrios Unidos in Chimayó received their pamphlets we sent, at no charge, to help a new group get going, unfortunately we were unable to provide BB's at no charge, but we'll have BB's on hand in Ruidoso & they can be bought there with no postage fee.(Ed. note: The pamphlets were on the table at our Saturday morning breakfast meeting in Chimayó. Thanks Manuel).

We finally delivered the Spanish prayer cards and large print Spanish service manual upon a prepaid special order; the orderer said she had wanted, and waited for the prayer cards for 30 years, and upon contacting our committee just took a few months, and were delivered in person, thus another happy ending.

A member had offered to print as many as we wanted GSO's notice on safety in meetings, we contacted him and he graciously offered to send 100 booklets so we can have on hand at the state convention. Thank You, you know who you are, and know AA is better for your service in our opinion.

We are looking forward to the State Convention in Ruidoso NM, June 2-4; we have reserved 4-5 tables for our literature display, and will be fully stocked & functional.

On a personal note, as Dr. Bob stated in our 11th Tradition, it's not breaking anonymity within the rooms. ("He [Dr. Bob] said there were two ways to break the Anonymity Tradition: (1) by giving your name at the public level to press or radio; (2) by being so anonymous that you can't be reached by other drunks." In an article in the February 1969 Grapevine: "Dr. Bob on Tradition Eleven," Volume 25, Issue 9, D. S. Of San Mateo, California, wrote that Dr. Bob commented on the Eleventh Tradition, "We need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio and films," as follows:

"Since our Tradition of Anonymity designates the exact level where the line should be held, it must be obvious to everyone who can read and understand the English Language that to maintain Anonymity at any other level is definately a Violation of this Tradition."

"The AA who hides his identity from his fellow AAs by using only a given name Violates The Tradition just as much as the AA who permits his name to appear in the press in connection with matter pertaining to AA.")

ELF is a confidential publication, as are emails, but not, in some cases. Facebook for whom non AA's may see & read AA correspondence, careful with that in today's world, so I'll mention, be on the lookout in the July issue of the Grapevine, a picture of my home group, the Cosmopolitan Group in Albuquerque will be printed. We are happy the picture was chosen upon the many they receive we're sure.

Special Needs...

Greeting from Taos!

With a lot of conferences going on this time of the year, I thought it would be good to share with you about special needs at AA conferences (AA Guidelines). Providing services for AAs who are deaf or hard of hearing may need special considerations when attending an AA conference or convention. For those who have a fair amount of hearing and/or who read lips, seating near the speaker may be all that is required. In some cases amplified headsets are provided. Others who are deaf may require the use of a sign language interpreter.

Here are some points to consider when planning a conference or meeting that will be attended by deaf or hard of hearing A.A.s. 1. reserve interpreters well ahead of time because they are in great demand; 2. budget the interpreting expenses. Find out early what the estimated cost will be, whether by the hour or by the day. If you are holding concurrent workshops, you may need more than one interpreter at the same time. If your event is small (and short) you may be fortunate to find a qualified volunteer, but do not expect to rely on volunteers; 3. in arranging preferred seating for deaf or hard of hearing members, designate the reserve area clearly: "Please reserve for hearing-impaired members"; 4. sensitize workshop leaders and meeting chairpersons to the use of the interpreter; 5. stick with your plans once you have announced that an event is sign-language accessible. Consider that there may be fewer events accessible in ASL to deaf members. Any unexpected or last minute removal of services could be problematic, especially for those members who may have travelled long distances to attend; 6. if the event is a large one with concurrent meetings and workshops, plan for continuous availability of several interpreters; 7. if you are listing the event with the Area 46, your local intergroup, or in any A.A. publication, specify that it is sign language interpreted.

If possible, have a T.D.D. number that deaf people can call for more information. For A.A.s With Other Special Needs Committees assist A.A. members who have a variety of challenges to accessing the A.A. message. For example, if meetings are wheelchair accessible, this may be noted in the program. If you have any questions, please contact me.

CPC in Action, Again...

District 18's Cooperation with the Professional Community (CPC) committee met with a panel of UNM addiction specialists who are part of the ASAP, Addictions & Substance Abuse Program, at 2600 Yale Blvd on April 18^{th.} With the allotted time of 30 minutes the CPC committee of four AA members was prepared to carry AA's message, giving the panel of specialists enough time for a brief question and answer period at the end.

Using the Preamble as the basic guideline, each committee member spoke for five minutes on important aspects of what AA does and does not do; our non affiliation with outside organizations and institutions; and our singleness of purpose, weaving in their personal stories of recovery.

The 12 member panel of doctors, counselors and mental health professionals were able to see how the AA program works in the personal accounts of experience, strength and hope from AA members with sobriety ranging from 20 plus years to the youngest member with two years.

The first question asked by the panel: What is the most important step?" was met with a resounding response: Step One! As the four committee members spoke, the skepticism and doubt seemed to melt away and the warmth that is always felt in the fellowship of the rooms became evident. It was a fine example of AA non-professionals meeting with professionals on the same level playing field of the life and death struggle with addiction. It worked and the committee has been invited back to meet with another group of specialists in the near future.




